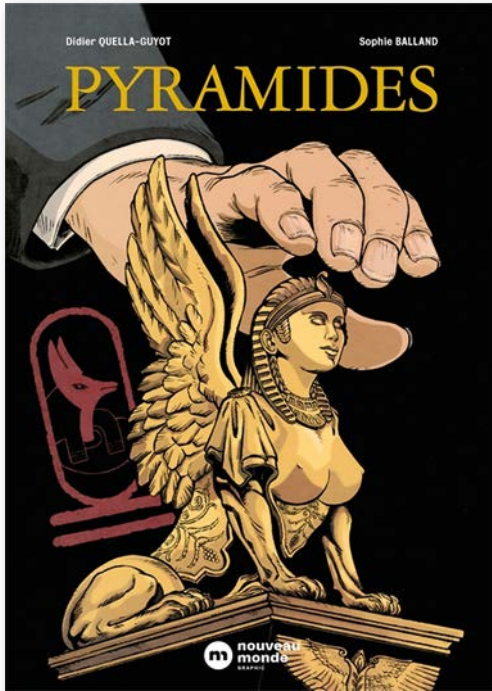

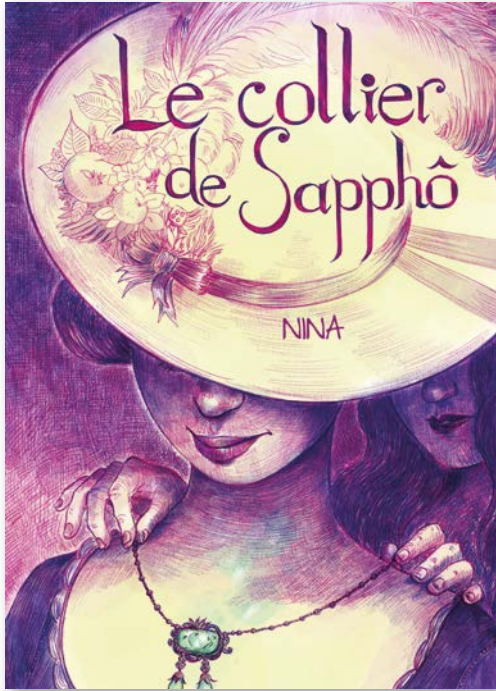

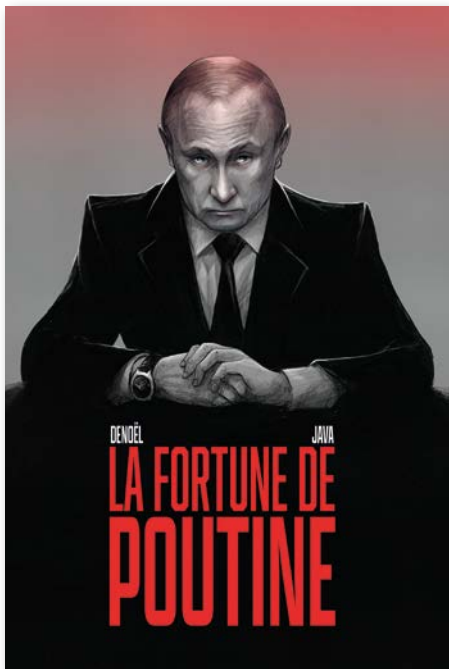
French Commando

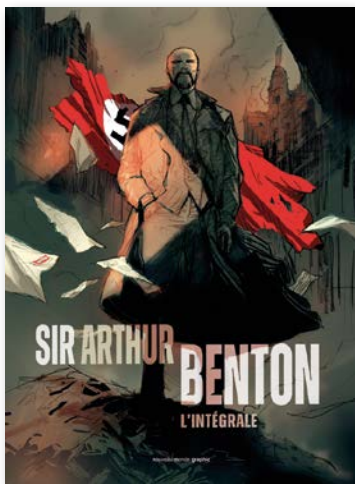
Julius Caesar's Gallic War
